TRINITY SCHOOL New York, NY

(grades K–12)

A college preparatory, coeducational, independent day school. The faculty members have more than 20 doctorates and 96 master's degrees from colleges and universities around the world. Celebrates its 300th anniversary this year.

HORACE MANN SCHOOL New York, NY

One of the largest independent day schools in the U.S. Students, in various grades, study an array of subjects and topics. For example, kindergarten children are introduced to the logic and strategy of chess, while ninth graders perform Shakespeare in the original and modernized forms.

TREY WHITFIELD SCHOOL Brooklyn, NY

Its mission is to equip its students for life by providing an affordable, high-quality education that also nurtures the development of faith and character. In seventh grade, for instance, students study algebra, which is a full year to three years earlier than public school students.

PHILLIPS ACADEMY ANDOVER Andover, Mass.

Has a roster of 300 courses, more than 150 electives, opportunities for pursuing independent study and study abroad projects are aplenty. About 40 percent of the student body is black. The teacher–student ratio is five to one. Over the past four years, students have matriculated to various institutions, including Harvard and Yale.

ANCONA SCHOOL Chicago, Ill.

Educates students to become creative problem solvers, confident risk takers and independent life-long learners. Rooted in the Montessori tradition, this child-centered school builds a strong academic foundation. In 2006, *Chicago Magazine* named Ancona one of the 25 best private elementary schools in the Chicago metropolitan area.

THE WINSOR SCHOOL Boston, Mass.

Is an independent day school for academically promising and motivated girls. The school enrolls approximately 430 students from diverse cultural, racial and ethnic backgrounds and maintains an average class size of 13 students.

NOBLE AND GREENOUGH SCHOOL

According to Avenues' founder, Chris Whittle, students will not only graduate at the top of their class, but they will also be masters of their own passions, such as ballet, while exemplifying fluency in a foreign language and culture. As a result, he believes they'll truly compete with their global counterparts. "Schools need to do a better job preparing children for international lives," Whittle has said.

When the school opens next fall, for about \$40,000 in tuition, the curriculum includes bilingual classroom instruction with Mandarin or Spanish. For more details, visit avenues.org.
